**Q: Who are Trisch and Noel Johnson?**

A: Trisch and Noel have been attending a Lutheran Brethren Church for 24 years and have been going on and/or leading short-term mission trips with e3 Partners (formerly Global Mission Fellowship) for the past 10 years. Trisch is a nurse and Noel is a physician. They are associate staff members of e3 Partners.

## Yagoua, Cameroon

Cameroon is a historically stable country in the hinge of Africa, the middle of the West coast. We partner with The Lutheran Brethren Church of Cameroon (EFLC). They have asked for help with evangelism, church planting and medical clinics. We'll be taking the gospel to nominal Muslims, and animists, planting churches in areas where no witness for Christ now exists, and holding free medical clinics in Yagoua near the Logone River which divides Cameroon and Chad.



## ITINERARY

**Tuesday January 12th, 2010** - Team will depart the U.S. from Seattle and fly to Paris. After a short layover the Team will depart to Ndjamena, Chad where we will overnight at the CLBA Welcome Center and then travel to Yagoua, Cameroon.

**While you are in Cameroon...**each day you will partner with local believers to share the gospel in the community and/or serve in a health care setting in exciting and creative ways. You will be helping either to start a brand new church, strengthen an existing one, or serve in a free medical clinic. One day will be set aside for touring, shopping and free time.

**Sunday, January 24th, 2010** - Arrive back in Seattle with many stories and memories to share.

## Campaign Cost

\$4,100\* based on leaving from Seattle, WA  
\*contingent on airfare final costs

### Cost Includes:

**Transportation:** Round-trip economy airfare from Seattle and daily transportation to and from campaign sites. Visas and Exit taxes, porters.

**Meals:** Meals are provided on work days. You are responsible for snacks and food on travel days. Clean drinking water is provided as well.

**Lodging:** Hotels, Missions and Welcome Center

**Transfers:** Round-trip transfers from airport to hotel.

**Literature:** EvangeCubes, evangelistic tracts and gift New Testaments.

**Miscellaneous:** Medications and medical supplies for free clinic.

## Frequently Asked Questions (continued):

### Q: Why not simply go and share the gospel, make disciples and plant churches?

A: James speaks to this in the second chapter, verse fifteen. "Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. 16 If one of you says to him, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it?" NIV

### Q: Why not simply go and hold free medical clinics in Jesus' name?

A: Although Jesus healed and drove out evil spirits, His prime focus was on preaching the gospel (Mk 1:33-39) and His final instructions focused on making disciples (Matt 28:19). We strive to keep His main focus as our main focus.

### Q: Why Yagoua, Cameroon?

A: We have been invited by the Lutheran Brethren Church of Cameroon to help them plant churches and strengthen churches in this area. In addition, they have requested help with medical care needs in the area, expressing hope for the re-opening of the vacant Martha Adaire Hospital there at some point. Lutheran Brethren Missionaries began working in Chad and Cameroon in the early 20th century. Yagoua was an early mission point.

### Q: What is e3 Partners?

A: e3 Partners is a interdenominational church-planting ministry that has been partnering with local churches in countries around the world since 1987 to help plant churches and disciple new believers. They use some unique evangelism tools such as the evangecube. They often combine church planting with medical mission, sports clinics, and children's programs.
